My son Peter has spoken very highly of Ms. Canji. She is a particular favorite of his, most likely because she is able to listen to and interact with kids with true interest in what they have to express. She is able to harness their energy to get them motivated to work hard and keep on track.

Since I volunteer weekly in my younger son's classroom, I have also had a chance to see Ms. Canji at work in the Kindergarten as well. She is a calm, cheerful presence in that setting and seems to truly enjoy herself.

I am very glad that she has been our building sub this year at Orrington Elementary, especially in my third grader's classroom. Third grade is an important year and my son's class is in a position to do well on their ISATs later this month, in part because of Ms. Canji.

I'm sorry that Orrington does not have a full time position to offer Ms. Canji next year. I think she definitely deserves her own classroom and her new school will be lucky to have her.
